









POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR POLICY

	<p>Staff at Camphill aim to understand student behaviour so that college is a positive experience for everyone.</p>
	<p>Students are expected to attend and take part in sessions and make a positive contribution both at college and outside of college e.g. on visits and work placements.</p>
	<p>Students are expected to treat everyone with respect.</p>
	<p>Students are expected to follow health and safety rules</p>
	<p>All students in college have a Positive Behaviour Support Plan which states what their needs are.</p>
	<p>All staff who are involved with a student will read their Positive Behaviour Support Plan. This is so that they know how best to support the student.</p>

	<p>All staff have training on how to manage behaviour.</p>
	<p>If a student is involved in a behaviour incident a written report will be made.</p>
	<p>Staff will work together to decide how to best support the student.</p>
	<p>Sometimes parents and carers and other external people become involved.</p>
	<p>Sometimes it is necessary to use physical intervention during a behaviour incident.</p>
	<p>All staff who work with students are trained in how to use physical intervention.</p>
	<p>Physical intervention is used as a last resort and is not often used.</p>

	<p>Sometimes a student may be asked to leave Camphill because of behaviour.</p>
	<p>The Principal makes any final decisions about exclusions which are very rare.</p>
	<p>The College has a legal duty to make sure that all students and staff are safe.</p>
