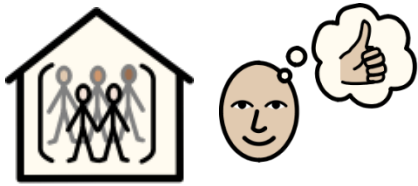
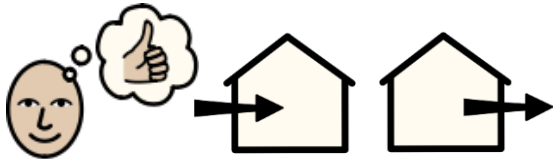
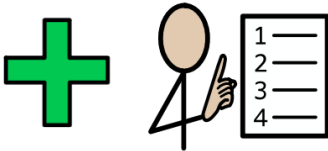
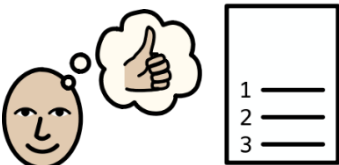
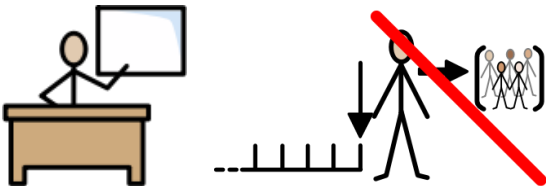


POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR POLICY

	Staff at Camphill aim to understand student behaviour so that college is a positive experience for everyone.
	Students are expected to attend and take part in sessions and make a positive contribution both at college and outside of college e.g. on visits and work placements.
	Students are expected to treat everyone with respect.
	Students are expected to follow health and safety rules
	All students in college have a Positive Behaviour Support Plan which states what their needs are.
	All staff who are involved with a student will read their Positive Behaviour Support Plan. This is so that they know how best to support the student.

	All staff have training on how to manage behaviour.
	If a student is involved in a behaviour incident a written report will be made.
	Staff will work together to decide how to best support the student.
	Sometimes parents and carers and other external people become involved.
	Sometimes it is necessary to use physical intervention during a behaviour incident.
	All staff who work with students are trained in how to use physical intervention.
	Physical intervention is used as a last resort and is not often used.
	Sometimes a student may be asked to leave Camphill because of behaviour.

	The Principal makes any final decisions about exclusions which are very rare.
	The College has a legal duty to make sure that all students and staff are safe.
